MINUTES

The minutes of the meeting held on the 31st May, 1984 were accepted as a correct record.

Matters arising

1. The Chairman asked what progress had been made regarding the leaflets on "Care Attendant Scheme" and was informed that this had been attended to, copies were given out to the Committee members. One thousand had been ordered.

The Photo-Copier had been purchased and maintenance of same was £3.20 per month.

2. Following the Inaugural Meeting held on the 21st of June, 1984 it was noted that the annual report 1983-4 and audited accounts would be required to be submitted to the National Crossroads Office.

Police Liaison

3. It was agreed that contact would be maintained with the Police Liaison Committee but the invitation to join the panel, would not be pursued.

6. Legality of Scheme

Further discussion was agreed that the question of Registration would be resolved at August 1984 meeting.

7. Progress

With a present total of forty four families and five attendants Salford Crossroads wheels were turning. Because of holidays now in hand, attendant help would be reduced so that the remaining helpers would find their hours increased to a possible fifteen hours or more per week.

From the 1st of August 1984, funds for seven Attendants would be available and two more Attendants would be recruited.

8. Treasurers Report

The Treasurer reported that Salford is agreeable to give all of Grant claim for final payment applied for.

The remaining funds from I.C.F. required to be expended by the 31st July 1984. No formal notification has yet been received as to the joint fundings for 1984-5.

Figure 1. The figure shows the relationship between the number of days of exposure to the sun and the number of days of exposure to the sun. The *Agrobacterium* strains were grown in the YEA medium for 24 h at 28 °C. The cell concentration of the *Agrobacterium* strains was adjusted to 1.0 × 10⁸ cells/ml. The cell suspension was then mixed with the plant tissue and the transformation efficiency was determined. The results are shown as the mean ± SD of three independent experiments. The asterisk indicates a significant difference (*p* < 0.05) between the two groups.

Future bookings will be applied for on block - August till November 1984 being every third Thursday of each month.

16. The Chairman, on behalf of the Committee, formally thanked John Mansfield for his outstanding work for Salford Crossroads. It was good to know that John was moving from the district for the happiest of reasons, but that Crossroads was losing a prop that would be greatly missed.
