At the end of the International Year of Disabled People 1981, some form of coordinating group of disabled people had been established in each of the ten GMC districts. During the last three years these groups have increasingly shared their expertise and resources, and this informal support of disabled people by disabled people across the County has produced three prominent County Committees:-1) Greater Manchester Housing & Disability Group; 2) Greater Manchester Highways & Disability Group; 3) Action on Disabled Persons Transport (ADAPT) - Greater Manchester; plus a need to establish an accessible, responsive organisation which will promote and strengthen the full participation of disabled people in the aforesaid Committee and other Community issues which affect the lives of disabled people in GMC, by liaison with existing groups.

This need was endorsed by a Meeting convened by the Greater Manchester Disability Action Group in County Hall on Saturday 16 June when disabled people representative of all districts in GMC agreed to establish a Greater Manchester Coalition of Disabled People and elected a Steering Group.

The prime requisite of the Greater Manchester Coalition is to obtain a Project base ie a Resource Centre staffed by disabled people which will be a focal point for its activities and a 'clearing-house' for those groups affiliated to it. The Centre would attempt to mobilise resources to improve local conditions and enable disabled people to become more self-reliant and/or assist them to come the problems presented by the social or physical handicap they experience.
